Dear interested public and government officials,

The U.S. Forest Service has begun a study that analyzes the road system on the Ottawa National Forest. This study is part of the Travel Management Rule, nationallyadopted by the U.S. Forest Service in 2005 (36 CFR Part 212). For our local study to be successful, we need input from the public, interested organizations, and other governments. To help share information about our road study, and gather input from stakeholders like you, we have scheduled three open house events:

- Monday, September 22, Iron River. 3 to 6 PM CST. Iron River City Hall. 107 W Genesee Street. Iron River, MI.
- Thursday, September 25, Ironwood. 3 to 6 PM CST. Gogebic Community College, Lindquist Center. E4946 Jackson Road, Ironwood, MI.
- Tuesday, September 30, Ewen. 3 to 6 PM EST. Ewen-Trout Creek School board room. 14312 Airport Road. Ewen, MI.

The open houses are meant to be an informal, two-way information-sharing event. You may come or go any time between 3 and 6 PM, local time.

Subpart A of the Travel Management Rule discusses road system management. It Requires each National Forest to "identify the minimum road system needed for safe and efficient travel and for administration, utilization, and protection of National Forest System Lands" (36 CFR 212.5b1). To determine the road system, Forests must use a science-based analysis and involve the public and local officials. Every National Forest will complete their study by the fall of 2015. The studies analyze all the system roads on the forest for their existing use and characteristics, need for management activities and public access, benefits, environmental risks and maintenance costs.

A team is currently working to identify a minimum road system on the Ottawa National Forest. We began this analysis using 25 criteria developed by the USFS Eastern Region, including risk and benefits such as: access, wildfire prevention, wildfire control, invasive species, heritage, wildlife, recreation, water, watersheds, vegetation management, forest health, special forest products, and soils.



The Forest Service will consider input from the public, in addition to analyzing agency needs for access to manage the forest. Criteria under consideration include analyzing each road's benefit, potential risks to natural resources, and agency costs to manage. Your input at this time can help us determine which criteria (benefits or risks) are important for understanding the Ottawa's transportation needs. The road study is not a decision, but is intended to help inform possible road management planning. Before any future actions are taken regarding the status of or access on specific roads, the Forest Service will provide additional opportunities for the public to participate in the process.
